

The Riding Centre Celebrates its 50th birthday

When retired dancer Louise Soelberg stood gazing across these fields and woods, contemplating an aged barn and the blue Ohio skies, she imagined the place filled with healthy children learning to ride, to work, to carry themselves with grace, and to live responsibly on the earth and in their communities. Fifty years later, her vision lives vigorously here.

Initially, Louise had to persuade Antioch College to let her use the barn and house and fields, offering riding instruction for the college's students and care for the property as incentive for the college's cooperation. She brought creative talents, personal discipline and a powerfully persuasive personality to that negotiation and to all the challenges of creating the Riding Centre. She turned opportunity into advantage, for example, when a group of Peace Corps volunteers ap-

proached her needing riding instruction before they set off on their mission. She agreed to teach them to ride and handle horses if they would build her an indoor riding ring. We still ride in that ring today.

Over the past half century, the Riding Centre has grown, now occupying 50 acres and operating out of two barns. The therapeutic program has become an important priority. The buildings have been restored and rebuilt. Fences replaced. Students have grown and sometimes bring their own chil-

dren here for lessons. But the essentials of the Riding Centre remain constant—dependable horsemanship, personal growth and joy.

Over the past 50 years, thousands of people have been involved with and touched by the Riding Centre as students, volunteers, employees, association members, riders, clinicians, and friends. Some former students have gone on to become equestrian competitors, veterinarians, wranglers and riding instructors. It is much harder to calculate how many have internalized the strength, patience, and happiness they gained in the barns, in the rings and on the trails of the Riding Centre.

There are 50 years worth of great stories at the Riding Centre. You can feel that history in the rafters and on the soil and in the horses' breath, or you can ask someone who's been here a little longer than you have to share some memories. Or better yet, start building some of your own!

Some Thoughts on Unsung Heroes of the Riding Centre

If you come to the Riding Centre for a visit, nine times out of ten, you're going to see Carolyn Bailey there, whether she's teaching a lesson or mucking out a stall. If you come in the morning or evening, you might also see one of our barn workers doing what they do. The Riding Centre has a staff of seven part-time workers and Carolyn, who go about doing the daily chores that need to be done, such as cleaning stalls and tending to the horses.

What you probably don't know is that sometimes situations arise that need extra attention, and the cavalry must be called in. Lucky for us, the cavalry is often Carolyn's husband, Chris Bailey, or Marsha's husband, David Williamson, or Adriene's husband, Jeff May. They don't have to help out; they aren't employees of the Riding Centre. They donate their time and energy with a smile whenever they're called upon. And they've been called on a lot lately.

Since the fall, the weather has been wreaking havoc on our area, beginning with the wind storm back in September. At the Riding Centre many trees and limbs came down, knocking down fences and blocking trails, not to mention all the leaves, sticks, and debris that were blown around. Jeff, a teacher by trade, could have stayed home

and relaxed since school was canceled, but he used his days off to help clear fallen trees and repair fences at the Riding Centre. Of course, Chris was there, too. If you would have come to the Centre just days after that storm, you would never even have known that it had happened. Thank you, Jeff and Chris!

This winter has been brutally cold, with

temperatures often dipping well below zero. These cold temperatures make the barn work more difficult because when the temperatures fall so low, all the horses' water buckets freeze almost solid. These buckets have to be emptied every day. (I say "emptied;" we call it "banging out the buckets," and it's hard work.) On one of these extremely cold days, Marsha's husband, David, came to the barn and proceeded to "bang out" the frozen buckets, to the delight of the semi-frozen stall cleaners. He has since earned the name "Bucket Man" and comes to the barn to empty frozen buckets whenever he is summoned. Thank you, David!

With the extremely cold weather comes frozen pipes. This winter at McCally Barn, the water hydrant froze and the pipes burst. Carolyn's husband Chris donated his time to dig up the old hydrant and replace it in less than ideal conditions. This task was

accomplished in a few hours, and most of the boarders there didn't even know anything had broken in the first place. Chris also did some minor repair work on a stall just for fun. Thank you, Chris!

These examples are only highlights of the important contributions of partners of our staff. We are so lucky at the Riding Centre to have a dedicated staff who do their work in any conditions Mother Nature can throw at them, with a little (sometimes a lot of) help from the unsung heroes (also known as the cavalry, the husbands, the partners) who step in cheerfully whenever they are called on to do what needs to be done.

So, if you come to the Riding Centre for a visit, you probably won't see Chris, or Jeff, or David, but you can look around and see the fruits of their donated labor. Thanks again to our unsung heroes!

Post Script: Chris Bailey Saves the Day... Again. After completing this article, I just found out that Chris spent most of yesterday breaking up several inches of ice that had accumulated over the past few weeks at the Riding Centre and was beginning to thaw. Unfortunately, the thawing ice was melting into the main barn and beginning to flood some stalls. Chris arrived with his ingenuity and a song and after several hours and blisters on his hands from breaking up the ice, averting a flood disaster. This just proves to me that Chris is a Riding Centre hero. Thank you, Chris!
