The More Things Change, The More They Stay The Same...


I was recently given a small notebook from Louise Soelberg's daughter, Jessica Andrews. As you know, Louise founded The Riding Centre and was a mentor to me and many others. Her philosophy of good horsemanship resonates throughout every aspect of what we do. The notebook contained her notes for an interview she would give in the 1970s to a local newspaper.

After reading through and interpreting (after all they are just notes) her iconic writing, I realized that what The Riding Centre does — and sometimes struggles with — today is also what Louise contended with 50 years ago. I think for anyone who loves The Riding Centre, her words of wisdom are worth hearing now, so here are the transcribed notes in the form they are written, as an interviewer (Judy) with a question and Louise's answer:

JUDY: I have often wondered, Louise, how you started The Riding Centre?

LOUISE: I started The Riding Centre in 1960 [1959] as an education project, not only to teach riding, but with a special emphasis on the care and understanding of horses. It was also an answer to a need in the community, often expressed by young people, to give them a place where they could be in a safer, pleasant environment.

As I look back over the years, I realize that our work always had a kind of therapeutic accent. Aside from the improvement in their physical well being, we saw children becoming more self-reliant, more responsible, more self-confident, and certainly they had an enormous enjoyment in their affectionate friendship with the horses. This led us to offer this kind of experience to disabled children, not only



I realized that what The Riding Centre does and sometimes struggles with — today is also what (founder) Louise Soelberg contended with 50 years ago.

In 1974, we started the first pilot program with three small children. The program has been growing steadily since. As you know, Judy, funding is our biggest problem, and we depend on donations and grants, as well as organizing some events of our own, such as an annual horse show and ride-a-thon, in order to support the program. Our instructors are certified at the Cheff Center for the Handicapped, which is the largest training facility in the country.

And there, Judy, you have it in a nutshell.

Although our riders still ride an obstacle course with 10 challenges during their lessons, parents and other kind people wishing to participate can do so online. Beau seems an odd choice since he has plenty of issues with changes in the arena, veterinarians approaching him, and deer appearing out of nowhere. On the other hand, he offsets these behaviors with his soft kind eyes, his smooth canter, and his willingness to please. Many thanks to everyone who chose Beau, and every other horse, to help us surpass this year's goal of \$10,000. Your continued generosity helps The Riding Centre fulfill its mission to teach good horsemanship to anyone who wants to learn, regardless of ability.

The Amazing David Williamson



The man was David Williamson, a Xenia native who is a world-renowned magician. When his wife told me that magic was his profession, all I could think was "Who does that?"

But what a great magician he is. As his wife and two children became more involved at the Centre, David saw our constant need for fundraising and stepped right up. Hosting benefit shows from the Kuss Auditorium to the Cedarville Opera House, David has captivated audiences with his energy, humor, and sleight of hand. Words cannot describe the way David makes magic come to life, whether he's on stage or in the barn yard, since he always has a deck of cards or silver dollars handy.

When Covid came to our world in 2020, David used his computer skills to take our biggest fundraiser, the annual Ride-A-Thon, virtual, helping make it the most successful ever. David is responsible for most of the artwork we use and
